










EXAMINATIONS RESULTS FOR FIRST BATCH OF CBME CURRICULUM

SESSION ON HISTORY OF MEDICINE 09/06/2021






A webinar was organized by the department of Biochemistry, AIMS as a part of the Biochemistry webinar series, on 16th April 2021 at 11.00 am

Guest Lecture on "Safe food today for a healthy tomorrow"







Using Technology to Enhance Medical Education



he use of technology in health care delivery has evolved rapidly in terms of expectations in patient care, adopting newer and advanced technology in diagnosis and treatment of clinical conditions and is also playing a vital role in patient education. This has also brought in several changes in medical education. Medical educators

across the globe are challenged to use these innovations in technology in training the "next generation" physicians.

The use of technology in medical education has gained enormous significance over the last decade. Advances in communication and information technology have been very rapid. They have diffused into our day-to-day life in the form of the internet, personal computers, and smart handheld devices. Adapting to this new norm has definite implications in education.

Since its beginning, the COVID-19 pandemic has been reported to affect more than 1.6 billion learners in more than 200 countries and has deprived them of face-to-face teaching. Ever since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, medical education and training have been significantly disrupted. The absence of face-to-face teaching and lack of interaction with patients has greatly affected clinical training. Addressing the skill training of the young doctors using online teaching has been an enormous challenge. The pandemic has further enhanced the need for adopting technology in medical education to deliver the curriculum in the absence of face-to-face teaching effectively. Online teaching and e-learning have become an integral part of the medical curriculum these days.

Challenges to adapting to technology in medical education

Even though cognitive, attitude, and ethical components have been addressed to a great extent using online platforms, the challenge remains in training in psychomotor skills. Practical and clinical component forms a significant part of the medical education curriculum and technology can play a considerable role in compensating for the absence of face to face teaching.

The major challenge in adapting technology in medical education remains in recreating compelling, real-life clinical encounters, the doctor-patient interaction, learning essential clinical skills remotely. Apart from the clinical learning happening in the hospital, skill and simulation labs played a crucial role in training undergraduates and postgraduates. But, the absence of students on campus has resulted in a significant lacuna in professional training.

Another significant challenge is to provide all students uninterrupted access to learning resources. This may not be easy considering that most students still may not have access to good internet facilities and smart devices. Educators worldwide need to find ways of reaching out to every student so that no one is deprived of their right to access quality medical education.

The pandemic has provided a great opportunity to medical educators to experiment, innovate in transforming the principles of medical education, pedagogical techniques, and assessments to address the void created by the pandemic. The real challenge is to adapt to this new norm by encouraging the use of artificial intelligence, virtual reality and learning engineering in the field of medical education.

Medical educators across the globe have responded well in adapting to the newer need and challenges in implementing the medical curriculum during this difficult period of the pandemic. The response has included a rapid shift to the use of both synchronous and asynchronous modes of online teaching-learning methods, adopting effective learner involvement strategies, and also use of innovative assessment techniques to assist learning and also assess learning

Various web-based platforms, learning management systems, social media have been used vigorously by educators to provide the best learning experiences to medical

students across the globe. Telemedicine, artificial intelligence, and chatbots are being increasingly used to achieve an easy connection between educators and students and doctors and patients.

There has been an increasing trend in the use of open educational resources (OER). This OER are available free of cost to both educators and the students. Swayam Prabha, the free DTH channel for education, by the ministry of MHRD, Government of India, is one such example of an OER which is providing lakhs of medical students free and complete access to resources related to the medical curriculum. A wonderful initiative created by collaborative efforts of the eminent faculties across the country is trying to fill in the doid created by the pandemic

Remote medical education needs to quickly adapt to the six steps of Kern's curriculum design. This calls for a collaborative effort from all medical educators across the world. All educators must assess the learner's need in the online learning environment, define achievable learning objectives, focus on identifying ideal instructional techniques to engage the learner, assess the learner, provide feedback, and feedforward. As quoted by Said HT and Schwartz AW, the focus of the medical educators should be on the pedagogy but not the platform!

Remote medical education is here to stay, even long after this pandemic is over. This transformative change will have significant benefits but will also throw several challenges at us. Ultimately, we need to look forward and adapt strategies that best suit the needs of our students and avoid scarring that the pandemic is threatening to leave behind!

A Rare case report of Fahr's Disease/ Calcinosis nucleorum / Primary familial brain calcification

INTRODUCTION

Fahr's disease other wise called as Calcinosis Nucleorum/
Primary familial brain calcification, named after Karl Theodor
Fahr a german neurologist who first reported the disorder in
1930. It is a rare neurological condition with prevalence of < 1/1,
000,000 with autosomal dominant in heritance, incomplete and
age-related penetrance with phenomenon of anticipation,
characterized by abnormal idiopathic calcification, with calcified
deposits in areas of the brain that control movement, including
the basal ganglia, cerebral cortex, thalamus, hippocampus,
dentate nucleus, cerebral cortex and cerebellar subcortical
white matter. Symptoms of the disorder depends on areas
effected by deposits

AIM


 An attempt to present a rare case report of fahr's disease
 To Address the diagnostic challanges misleadings during diagnosis of a rare entity fahr's disease

METHOD- CASE REPORT

A 60 year old male case of seizure disorder since 2 years on phenotoin 100mg on irregular treatment for the Past few months, was brought to casualty with History of tremulousness of both upper limbs since past 2 months, and multiple episodes of convulsions with since early morning. with no other known comorbidities. A significant family history of his Father having features suggestive of parkinsonism and son having seizures since 6 months with persistent headache was noted. On examination patient had postural tremors, rigidity, bradykinesia, other features of parkinsonism with no other significant finding.

RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

CT Brain showed extensive bilateral symmetric calcification involving bilateral centrum semiovale, corona radiata, basal ganglia, thalamus and periventricular white matter, with diffuse brain parenchymal atrophic Changes, characteristic of Fahr's disease. Other relevant investigations done- did not show any significant abnormalities.



Fahr's disease is a rare neurological condition possess many diagnostic challanges while many conditions which mimic in clinical presentation, diagnosis can be made with presence of Progressive neurologic dysfunction with onset at any age, Radiographic evidence of bilateral calcification of basal gang lia and some other regions of the brain, Absence of biochemical abnormalities suggestive of endocrinopathies, mitochondrial or other systemic disorders, Absence of infections, toxin or trauma, family history with autosomal dominant inheritance

CONCLUSION

- Fahr's disease is rare Neurogenetic disease with many clinical mimickers like parkinson disease, mitochondrial myopathy. It's a diagnosis of exclusion,
- Thorough knowledge about the disease is needed for the clinician and Patients family in dealing with fahars disease as there is a significant family history.

AN INTERESTING CASE OF RHEUMATIC HEART DISEASE IN AN ELDERLY

INTRODUCTION

- Rheumatic heart disease remains common in developing countries, where its prevalence is underestimated by clinical examination. Although the incidence of rheumatic fever has considerably decreased in industrialized countries in the past 60 years, RHD has not disappeared.
- This condition remains the most common form of valvular disease in developing countries, where it primarily affects young adults. Residual RHD still exists in elderly patients who were exposed to acute rheumatic fever during childhood when rheumatic fever was still endemic. Prevalence is estimated at 2–3% when using systematic echocardiographic screening. RHD in the elderly is a rare entity and can cause diagnostic dilemma if the treating physician is not aware of such entities. This case report describes one such scenario.

<u>AIM-</u> An attempt to present a case report of an interesting case of RHD in an elderly patient.

METHODS- CASE REPORT

64 year elderly male patient presented with complaints of chest pain, on and off since 2 years, giddiness, on and off since 1 year, aggravated since one month, breathlessness since one year, which increased in severity past 15 days. He is a known hypertensive, on treatment since past 12 years. On examination, he had mid-diastolic murmur in mitral area. Investigations including CBC with cardiac markers and other routines were normal. Chest X-ray showed cardiomegaly with left atrial dilatation. ECHO showed RHD, dilated left Atrium, severe Mitral stenosis, with Mitral valve area of 1.0 cmsq, mild MR, mild TR/PAH with EF of 60%. He was treated with furosemide, telmisartan, spironolactone; sildenafil for 5 days and was referred to a cardiac centre for ptmc/valve replacement.

DISCUSSION AND RESULTS

- RHD is a late consequence of acute rheumatic fever, which is initiated by pharyngeal or cutaneous infection caused by group A βhemolytic Streptococci. Approximately 60% of patients with acute rheumatic fever will develop RHD. Besides recurrences of streptococcal infections, which have a major role in the development of RHD, individual host susceptibility and associated infections are likely to contribute to RHD. In addition, RHD is favored by overcrowding, malnutrition, and limited access to health care. The near elimination of acute rheumatic fever and reduction in the rates of RHD in high-income countries during the late 20th century was attributed in part to improvements in socioeconomic conditions and the widespread use of Benzathine penicillin G to treat streptococcal pharyngitis. In 2015, the countries with the largest estimated numbers of cases of RHD were India (13.17 million cases), China (7.07 million) and India had the highest estimated numbers of deaths due to RHD (119,100 deaths).
- Clinically manifest RHD is just "TIP OF THE ICEBERG". Absence of murmurs does not exclude persistence of valvular pathology. Overall prevalence of RHD was shown to range from 2.7 cases per 1000 population (for "clinically manifest" disease) to 21.1 cases per 1000 population (for "clinically silent" disease).
- Early detection is paramount to implement secondary prevention and limit the evolution towards severe valve damage. In this context, ECHO has emerged as a potential tool in high-burden populations allowing the detection of subclinical disease as well as the confirmation of clinically audible lesions. A better understanding of the immunogenetic determinants of the disease may provide a potential route to identify relevant bacterial antigens that could be used in the development of a vaccine against group A streptococcus.

CONCLUSION

- RHD in elderly is a rare entity but seen in developing countries.
- Echocardiography can pick up lesions not audible by auscultation.
- WHF criteria can help in ECHO diagnosis of RHD.
- These patients should be followed up for long periods to assess the damage to the valve. Early interventions in these patients can decrease morbidity and mortality.

A RARE CASE "SHEEHAN'S SYNDROME"

Introduction:

Sheehan's syndrome(SS) which was originally described by Sheehans, occurs as a result of ischaemic necrosis of pituitary gland due to severe postpartum haemorrhage1. Hypopituitarism is the partial or total loss of anterior pituitary hormone Secretion2. The prevalence of hypopituitarism is 46 cases per lakh with an incidence of 4 cases per lakh. Sheehan's syndrome is decreasing in frequency worldwide and is a rare cause of hypopituitarism owing to advance in obstetric care2. Long-standing pituitary damage is associated with increased mortality primarily due to increased cardiovascular and cerebrovascular mortality3. SS can present in the postpartum period or after many months to years following after the delivery. The gland has a great secretory reserve and more than 75% must be destroyed before clinical manifestations are evident4. They manifest as failure to lactate or to resume menses, genital and axillary hair loss, asthenia and weakness, fine wrinkles around the eyes and lips, signs of premature aging, dry skin, hypopigmentation. Hyponatremia is a uncommon presentation of the disease5.

Case Report:

A 43 year old female P3L2D1 presented with complaints of easy fatigability, puffiness of face and confusion since 2 months. She gives history of a normal vaginal delivery 12 years back at home which was complicated by severe postpartum haemorrhage (PPH) and being unconscious and was shifted to a primary health centre, where she was hospitalised for few days and managed conservatively for PPH and she had received blood transfusions, during which she recalled that she unable to breast feed her kid and she never got her menses following after last delivery. The patient also gave history of cold intolerance, decreased daily activities, hair loss, increased weight gain, increased sleep and drowsiness during most of the day and since 12 years.

On physical examination: Patient had dry skin, fine wrinkles, puffiness of face, absent axillary, pubic and skin hair.

Pulse rate: 70bpm

Blood Pressure: 110/78mmHg

Pallor - Present

Systemic examination:

RS: B/L normal vesicular breath sounds heard, no added sounds

CVS: S1 & S2 heard, no murmur

P/A: soft, non tender and no organomegaly

CNS: conscious and oriented, no focal neurological deficits

Blood investigations showed the following

Haemoglobin - 7.8gm/dl ▮

Total leukocyte count - 7480 cells/cumm

Platelet - 3.13 lakhs/cumm

RBS - 98mg/dl

Free T3 - 0.70, Free T4 - 0.35, Free TSH -1.73

FSH - 3.33IU/L 1, LH - 1.37IU/L 1

Prolactin - 1.17ng/dl I , Cortisol - 0.38mcg/dl I

Neuroimaging (MRI): Empty sella with complete thinning of pituitary gland

Based on the above investigations a diagnosis of SHEEHAN'S SYNDROME(SS) with pituitary failure presenting with delayed onset hyponatremia and hypotension was made.


Discussion:

SS is characterised by ischemic necrosis of the anterior pituitary gland resulting from postpartum haemorrhage(PPH). One of the most common cause of hypopituitarism in developing countries. The anterior pituitary is supplied mainly by the portal venous system which is a low pressure system. The main role in pathogenesis of the disease is enlargement of pituitary gland, small sellar size, disseminated intravascular coagulation and autoimmunity. SS is characterised by varying degrees of dysfunction of the anterior pituitary⁶. Enlargement of pituitary cells, particularly the lactotrophs, occur during pregnancy but without a corresponding matching increase in vascular supply. So whenever the pituitary becomes vulnerable to hypo-perfusion in the post partum period, ischemic necrosis of the pituitary gland occurs. SS can range from Panhypopituitarism to selective hormone losses. Hyponatremia is a rare presentation of SS, which is probably due to the underlying hormone deficiencies5

Conclusion:

Deficiency of various pituitary hormones and their target hormones produces a myriad of clinical features. The Diagnosis of SS is often challenging and a high index of suspicion is needed to diagnose this entity. MRI of the brain and pituitary fossa may show an empty sella but may not be diagnostic, history of postpartum haemorrhage, failure to lactate and cessation of menses are important clues for the diagnosis. Early diagnosis and appropriate treatment are necessary to reduce the morbidity and mortality.








speak for example, to use a computer to talk, access the web or control devices around their home.

COVID BOX". an acrylic board 70 20 cm and attached 3 bars 32 cm long and slide it under the side of the patient. A similar contraption is used on the other side. Then, it is covered by a polypropylene sheet 2' 2'. It makes a completely disposable airtight chamber with the polypropylene sheet.

there are no aerosols released in atmosphere after the procedure,

making it absolutely safe for bronchoscopist and at same time patient also remains safe. We are ready again in no time with fresh polypropylene sheet to do the next bronchoscopy.





WORLD LEPROSY DAY

On the occasion of National Anti-leprosy day and Martyr's day on 30th January 2021, we from the Department of Dermatology, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS) organized a 'free skin camp and Leprosy screening camp' at Government General Hospital, Nagamangala in association with Redcross, Sri Adichunchanagiri College of Arts, Commerce and Science and Government General Hospital, Nagamangala.

The inaugural function was held in the campus of Sri Adichunchanagiri College of Arts, Commerce and Science and was graced by presence of Honorable Chief guest- Mr. Kunhi Ahmed, Tahsildar, Nagamangala. Other dignitaries included Dr. M.G.Shivaramu, Dean and Principal, AH&RC, Dr. B.G.Sagar, Medical Superintendent, AH&RC, Mr. Naveen Kumar, DYSP, Nagamangala, Dr. Sharath, Taluk Health Officer, Dr. Venkatesh, Administrator, GPH, Nagamangala, Dr. B.K.Lokesh, Principal of Sri Adichunchanagiri College of Arts, Commerce and Science. Department of Dermatology, AIMS was represented by Dr. M R Swaroop, Professor and Head of the Department, Dr. Neethu Nag, Senior Resident and post graduates.

The inaugural function commenced at 10.45 am. A two-minute silence was observed between 11 am and 11.02 am by the dignitaries and the gathering as a mark of respect for Mahatma Gandhi on his death anniversary.









The gathering was then addressed by chief guest and respected Tahsildar of Nagamangala- Mr. Kunhi Ahmed, with his talk on stigma associated with leprosy and highlighted contributions and life time achievements of Mahatma Gandhi towards leprosy. Following the inaugural speech by the chief guest, our beloved and esteemed Dean and Principal of Adichunchanagiri Hospital and Research Centre – Dr. M.G.Shivaramu, enlightened the gathering about the scientific knowledge, the etiology, treatment, National Leprosy Elimination Programme and protective measures of leprosy disease. Our esteemed Medical Superintendent, Adichunchanagiri Hospital and Research Centre- Dr. B.G.Sagar, subsequently addressed the gathering by talks on lifetime accomplishments of Mahatma Gandhi and his contributions towards leprosy. He also mentioned about the importance of recognizing cardinal symptoms like hypoanaesthetic patches, reduced sensation and unnoticed trivial trauma which should be followed by investigations like slit skin smear, which acts as a helping aid in proper and early diagnosis and thereby adequate treatment of the same.

The inaugural function was followed by a rally through the main streets of Nagamangala town by the staff, post graduates and interns of Department of Dermatology, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences. The students of Sri Adichunchanagiri College of Arts, Commerce and Science and ASHA workers also participated in the rally. Free skin camp was conducted from 9 am to 4 pm at Government General Hospital, Nagamangala. Around 100 patients with skin diseases were treated by our doctors. These patients were also screened for Leprosy. Free drugs were distributed to them and they were asked to come for follow up at our hospital.

Patients coming to the OPD were briefed about this disease- vitiligo. Having emphasized about the nature of this ailment, its course and prognosis in their own vernacular language, we tried to weed out the stigma accompanying the disease. Pictures and images were set forth at eminent locations in the OPD. We also highlighted the benign and non-communicable nature of the disease. All the misconceptions related to the disease were eliminated and the facts pertaining to the disease were explained to them. Various modes of treatment were also elaborately explained to the patients.

Additionally, handouts enclosing information about vitiligo in brief, myths and facts about the condition, were distributed to all the patients so as to create awareness among their family members and community. We also handed out free samples for the benefit of the patients. Thus, our main objective was achieved in exterminating the misconceptions of this disease and changing the perceptions among the patients about vitiligo and also motivated the patients in developing a constructive behavior towards a positive body image, irrespective of the color of the skin.





DEPRESSION IN ADOLESCENTS

Major depressive disorder is a common problem for adolescents but often is unrecognised. It has an array of symptoms affecting somatic, cognitive, affective, and social processes. Academic failure, poor peer relationships, behavioral problems, conflict with parents and other authority figures, and substance abuse are some of the consequences of major depressive disorder in this age group.

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The depressive disorders include MDD (Major depressive disorder), dysthymia, and bipolar disorder. MDD is the most common depressive disorder in adolescents. Major depressive disorder (MDD) often complicates the tumultuous adolescent years. It is observed that physiological, psychological, and social changes that characterize adolescence increase the risk for MDD. The impulsivity of adolescence combined with MDD also can lead to death by suicide. MDD is present when either depressed mood or a lack of pleasure in usual activities is present continuously for 2 weeks or more and is accompanied by five or more additional symptoms. Symptoms include changes in appetite, sleep, or weight; fatigue; decreased libido; difficulty concentrating; feelings of worthlessness; and, in moderate to severe cases of MDD, recurrent thoughts of death.

There is a strong genetic component in MDD, with the highest rates seen in first-degree relatives. The point prevalence for MDD in adolescents ranges from 0.4% to 8.3% and the lifetime prevalence is approximately 10% to 28%. Girls are twice as likely as boys to have MDD.

Dysthymic disorder (DD) also is seen in adolescents and is present when depressed mood or irritability is present every day for at least 1 year. It is accompanied by the same symptoms seen in MDD and feelings of hopelessness and low self-esteem, but it does not meet the full criteria for MDD. Adolescents with DD are at high risk of developing MDD, and when this occurs, it is referred to as double depression(DD). Also approximately 10% to 15% of adolescents with recurrent MDD will subsequently develop bipolar disorder. In bipolar disorder, both mania and MDD are part of the illness spectrum. Mania is characterized by an expansive or irritable mood accompanied by an inflated self-esteem, decreased need for sleep, extreme talkativeness, and flight of ideas. In adolescents, school failure and truancy, antisocial behavior, and substance abuse may be present.

Adolescents and young adults with a history of childhood maltreatment were 3 times more likely to become depressed or suicidal than were individuals without such a history. Poor adolescent interpersonal functioning and negative self-assessment associated with maternal depression has been linked to early onset. Insecure attachment and maternal negativity also have been linked to adolescent depression.

Co-morbidity with MDD in adolescents range from 40% to 70%. Most common co-morbidities include DD, anxiety disorders, disruptive disorders, and substance abuse. Also Suicide is the third leading cause of death among young people ages 15 to 24 years. Boys are 5 times more likely to commit suicide than are girls. Suicide attempts are most common among girls (3.3%).

Despite its prevalence, MDD remains undertreated or untreated. Early and aggressive treatment of adolescents can shorten episodes of MDD and reduce the risk for subsequent episodes. Effective treatments include SSRIs, coping skills training and cognitive behavioral therapy. Early assessment is key to depression detection and suicide prevention, especially in primary care settings. Questioning adolescents and using depression screening instruments aid in identifying MDD in this group. Through psycho-education, mental health workers can promote recovery from MDD by encouraging a healthy lifestyle, enhancing social skills, and assisting the adolescent to identify and use sources of social support. These measures can prevent adolescents' premature death and promote long-term well-being.



We accomplish the same by undertaking eye camps in the several villages surrounding our college.

Around 44 camps were conducted in various areas around AIMS. 984 Cataract cases and 77 miscellaneous cases were operated. Total number of cases operated from January 2021 to June 2021 were 1061. All surgeries were performed abiding by the NPCB and AHRC guidelines.

The second wave of covid 19 was quite a challenging phase of the pandemic. All faculty and postgraduate students were actively involved in managing COVID patients. Alongside we continued our Outpatient services even during the lockdown period. Through the pandemic, teaching programme was not hampered and virtual online teaching was resumed, for both undergraduate and postgraduate students as usual in time scheduled.

Totally 20 patients attended the camp of which 4 underwent laser procedures, free of cost. They subsequently were followed up by our faculty in Ophthalmology OPD, AIMS.

WORLD GLAUCOMA WEEK 7th to 13th MARCH 2021

The World Glaucoma WEEK was celebrated following the theme for this year as "The World is bright, save your sight!". The 2021 theme reflects the hope that with regular testing, people continue to see the world around us: full of beauty, charm and adventure.

Several Camps were conducted during this awareness week, during which over **822** patients were screened including OPD patients. About 15 known cases were followed up and 19 newly detected cases of primary and secondary glaucomas were diagnosed. Free anti- glaucoma drops were handed out to these patients.

We conducted a program in order to celebrate the "World Glaucoma WEEK" in our hospital premises on **9th March 2021** which was chaired by our beloved principal, Dr. M.G. Shivaramu; Dean and Director AIMS, Dr. B.G. Sagar; Medical Superintendent, Dr. H.T. Venkate Gowda; Professor and HOD Department of Ophthalmology. The event was attended by RMO, PROs, faculty members and all the postgraduates of the Department of Ophthalmology.

1. Tale of a happy child- Improvement in the survival rate and adequate pain management due to timely intervention.

Under the guidance of **Dr. H.T. Venkate Gowda**, Professor and Head, **Dr. Spoorthy S**, Assistant Professor and **Dr. Pooja H.V**, Assistant Professor had successfully performed excision biopsy of intraconal tumor on a 3 year old child from North-East India after being rejected at several hospitals. The child presented with severe propotosis and perforated corneal ulcer and was diagnosed to have Neurofibromatosis type 1. On histopathology it was diagnosed: Low grade Optic Nerve Glioma – Possibility of Pilocytic astrocytoma. The child has been on regular follow up since then and is doing well. We would like to extend our gratitude to the departments of Neurosurgery, Anaesthesia, Pediatrics, Pathology and Radiology for aiding in the diagnosis and management of this case.

2. Squint

18 year old male patient presented with right eye esotropia. Successful surgical correction was done by **Dr. Pooja H.V,** Assistant Professor.

- 3. Patients with **post COVID** sequelae presented to the OPD with varying manifestations.
 - a. First wave Conjunctivitis, Viral Retinitis which was successfully investigated and treated at our centre.

 b. Second wave - Mucormycosis, viral retinitis. All Covid positive mucormycosis cases were referred to mucormycosis treatment centre Victoria hospital, Bangalore for further manage ment.




Our department organised webinar series

MUCORMYCOSIS ---- A LURKING DANGER.

Introduction

Mucormycosis was also known as zygomycosisi which is caused by fungi belonging to order mucorales.rhizopus spiecies is the main causative organism. Mucormycosisis is rare but serious angio invasive infection.

Background

Mucormycosis is a fungal infection that mainly affects people who are on medication for other health aliments their by reducing their ability to fight environmental pathogens.

Sinues or lungs of such individuals get affected after spores are inhaled from the air.

There are six clinical types of mucormycosis, the most common form is rhinocerebral mucormycosis which is of greatest interest to the dental profession.

An ulcer or extraction wound in the mouth can be a port of entry for fungal invasion of the hard palate, maxillary bone, paranasal sinus, orbit, intracranial cavity and brain and rarely in the mandible.

Other sites of infection include the nose, lungs, gastrointestinal tract, skin, kidneys, and central nervous system.

Despite surgical and antifungal treatments the mortality rate is higher than 50% and even higher in immunocompromised patients.

Clinical features

- Nasal Obstruction
- Bloody Nasal Discharge
- Facial Pain Or Head Ache.
- Facial Swelling Or Cellulitis.
- Visual Disturbances With Concurrent Proptosis.
- Facial Paralysis In Case Of Facial Nerve Involvement.
- As The Disease Progresses In To Cranial Vault It May Lead To Blindness, Lethargy, Seizures, And Death.





PATHOGENISIS

Mucormycosis primarily occurs around rhinomaxillary or rhinocerebral areas involving facial tissues, palate, alveolar bone and mandibular bone. Inhalation through nasal passage or infection of extraction sockets with sporangiospores in immunocompromised patients always involve larger areas of necrosis and with systemic dissemination.

In healthy individuals, neutrophils when exposed to the Mucorales there is up regulation of Toll-like receptors and expression of nuclear factor kappa beta.

In immunocompetent individuals Mucorales are killed by generation of oxidative metabolites and cationic peptide defensins, which are impaired in acidosis and hyperglycemia.

Neutrophil dysfunctional states have high risk of developing mucormycosis not only by R. arrhizus species but also by less common varieties like corymbifera, A. elegans and Rhizomucor pussillus.

The factors influencing the pathogenicity of Mucorales are mainly:

- 1. The availability of the iron.
- 2. ketoacidosis.
- 3. pH.
- 4. The interactions of mucorale to the endothelium.

Mucorales obtain iron from host using high affinity iron permeases or by the low molecular weight iron chelators or by the usage of iron present in the hemoglobin through FTR1 gene expression.

Elevated serum iron and iron chelator (deferoxamine) have high incidence of mucormycosis. Iron usage by the Rhizopus is many folds than Candida, as it utilizes deferoxamine.

Diabetic ketoacidosis patients have high levels of serum iron and the pH ranging from 7.3 to 6.88, which is ideal environment for growth of Rhizopus.

In acidosis, disruption of binding capacity between iron and transferrin causes elevation of serum iron (ferric form). Rhizopus adheres to the laminin and Type IV collagen in extra cellular matrix, and induces endocytosis causing the endothelial damage.

Invasion of endothelial cells by the Mucorales lead to angioinvasion resulting in thrombosis subsequent to the tissue necrosis.

Pathogenesis and mechanism of bone destruction is attributed to the reduced vascularity by thrombi formation and inhibition of angiogenesis due to elevated levels of GRP 78.

DIAGNOSIS AND MANGEMENT

Diagnosing mucormycosis by imaging studies (radiological or CT or MRI), culture studies or serological tests are not unswerving. Good clinical examination with history and astute approach in treating without delay can reduce morbidity and mortality. Antifungal treatment by amphotercin group has many toxic side effects. There are clinical trails using azoles and echinocandins, iron chelators, hyper baric oxygen and cytokine therapy but the data till date shows that these drugs also have side effects.

Nonhealing of extraction sockets and immunocompromised states should alert high suspicion, judicious approach by the clinician and early diagnosis and appropriate management helps to reduce the size of defect and complications.


Prevention Anaerobic infections in the lungs and mouth can be prevented in a variety of ways, including:

- maintaining excellent oral hygiene, such as brushing and flossing twice a day
- · having any infectious fluids in your mouth suctioned out by your dentist
- keeping your stomach acid pH level balanced

Complications

Untreated anaerobic infections can lead to other serious conditions, including:

- brain, liver, or lung abscesses
- aspiration pneumonia
- anaerobic cellulitis
- chronic sinusitis
- periodontitis
- necrotizing gingivitis (also known as "trench mouth")
- sepsis





INTERESTING CASES OPERATED FROM OUR INSTITUTE

CASE 1: 70 yr old male patient came with complaints of pain abdomen since 4 days with history of vomiting non billous. On evaluation X-ray erect abdomen s/o multiple air fluid levels. USG abdomen F/s/o acute intestinal obstruction –CECT abdomen revealed acute intestinal obstruction with narrowing at distal ileal loop. Patient was planned and taken up for EXPLORATOTRY LAPROTOMY + PROCEED



INTRA-OPERATIVE FINDINGS:

Ileal band constriction noted at about 10cm proximal to ileocaecal juction with infarction of ileum about 95 cm length from band of constriction. Hence ileal resection of about 1metre was done with end to end anastomosis. Patient withstood the procedure with uneventful post-operative period and was discharged on Post-op day 14.

- Local scan of the left thigh- a well defined large multi lobulated hyperechoic lesion with multiple cysts with internal echoes noted measuring approximately 14.5 x 22.7 x 13.5 cm (3700 cc) in the subcutaneous plane .FNAC: F/S/O parasitic lesion with granulomatous reaction.
- Patient underwent EXCISION AND BIOPSY-
- Post -operative period uneventful
- HPE: F/S/O Hydatid cyst





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
CASE 4:

A 45years old male patient presented with pain abdomen and billous vomiting and discolouration of eyes since 1 week, Lab investigation showed deranged LFT, CECT abdomen showed a well defined homogenously enhancing soft tissue density mass lesion in the periampullary region involving distal CBD and ampullary region causing moderate upstream dilation of biliray system, CA19.9-3852U/L

Patient underwent Whipple's procedure and specimen was sent for HPE and report showed adenocarcinoma possibly of extra hepatic bile duct origin , TNM staging pT3 pN1 pMx with out off 2 out off 8 lymphnodes were positive for tumor

Post-op period Uneventful





CASE 5:

45 year old female presented with complaints of pain in right side of abdomen since 15days, history of nausea . On evaluating USG abdomen revealed hydatid cyst in caudate lobe with compression on the gall bladder, cystic duct and CBD causing dilatation of CBD, IHBR dilatation, rupture hydatid cyst in segment VI of liver with intra-cystic rupture and floating membrane within, MRI abdomen suggestive of hydatid cyst of liver with an exophytic component. Patient underwent **Exploratory** laparotomy + hydatid cyst de -roofing + cyst excision + cholecystectomy.





3) ACETABULAR FRACTURE TREATED WITH PLATING

A 45-year-old male patient who met with an RTA presented with left hip pain. On radiological investigations he was diagnosed to have medial wall, roof, anterior an posterior column comminuted fracture of left acetabulum. After preop workup and stabilizing the patient hemodynamical - ly, the patient was taken up for surgery under spinal anesthesia and he was operated under anterior Ilioinguinal approach. The fracture was reduced under C arm guidance and a buttress plate and recon plate was used for fixation. Wound was closed in layers using mesh to prevent hernia with help of general surgeons. A drain was placed insitu.



A 25-year-old male patient named Sunil had come with history of pain over right lower limb and inability to walk. He had history of trauma 9months back, treated elsewhere and now diagnosed to have infected non union of right tibial shaft fracture with failed implant insitu. Pre op workup was done and it was decided to go on with ilizarov procedure for him and he was taken for surgery.

Under spinal anesthesia Masquelet technique (wound debridement with antibiotic loaded bone cement spacer was placed insitu) was carried out. Then in the same sitting, ilizarov external fixator was used to stabilize the fracture. As it is a two-stage procedure. The second stage i.e., Corticotomy and distraction was planned to carry out after 6 to 8 weeks.



Implant removal with osteotomy with bone grafting followed by IM nailing of left tibia was done.



After Preop workup done, patient was taken up for surgery under spinal anesthesia. ACL reconstruction using semitendinosus graft and end prosthetic button was done with partial medial meniscectomy. He is doing well now with near normal range of knee movements.



A case bought to the radiology department for COVID-19 screening had incidental finding of Scimitar syndrome



SCIMITAR SYNDROME



SCIMITAR SYNDROME, ALSO KNOWN AS HYPOGENETIC LUNG SYNDROME, IS CHARACTERIZED BY A HYPOPLASTIC LUNG THAT IS DRAINED BY AN ANOMALOUS PULMONARY VEIN INTO THE SYSTEMIC VENOUS SYSTEM. IT IS A TYPE OF PARTIAL ANOMALOUS PULMONARY VENOUS RETURN AND IS ONE OF THE SEVERAL FINDINGS IN CONGENITAL PULMONARY VENOLOBAR SYNDROME.

CLINICAL PRESENTATION:

INFANTS PRESENT WITH SIGNS OF HEART FAILURE, WHICH MAY BE DUE TO ASSOCIATED CONGENITAL HEART DISEASE. ADULTS ARE MOST FREQUENTLY ASYMPTOMATIC BUT MAY HAVE RECURRENT PULMONARY INFECTION OR DYSPNEA ON EXERTION.

PATHOLOGY:

IT IS ESSENTIALLY A COMBINATION OF PULMONARY HYPOPLASIA AND PARTIAL ANOMALOUS PULMONARY VENOUS RETURN (PAPVR). IT ALMOST EXCLUSIVELY OCCURS ON THE RIGHT SIDE.

HAEMODYNAMICALLY, THERE IS AN ACYANOTIC LEFT TO RIGHT SHUNT. THE ANOMALOUS VEIN USUALLY DRAINS INTO:

INFERIOR VENA CAVA: MOST COMMON RIGHT ATRIUM PORTAL VEIN

IN SOME VARIANTS, THE ABNORMAL LUNG SEGMENT MAY RECEIVE ARTERIAL BLOOD SUPPLY FROM THE AORTA OR ITS BRANCHES. SOME CASES MAY SHOW THE ANOMALOUS SYSTEMIC ARTERIES SUPPLYING AN AREA OF ASSOCIATED PULMONARY SEQUESTRATION .



INTERESTING CASE:



CT FINDINGS:

Patient presented with swelling in the right madibular region following which plain CT and CE-CT was performed.

Large ill defined soft tissue density lesion noted involving posterior body, ramus of mandible on right side causing its destruction with few cystic with peripheral enhancement anterosuperiorly areas noted posteriorly. The lesion shows multiple tiny punctate calcifications. On contrast study lesion shows heterogenous enhancement. Laterally the lesion is seen infiltrating skin.

Medially extending into gingivobuccal space with lost fat planes with tongue and floor of mouth anteriorly, displacing the parapharyngeal fat plane posteromedially.

Posteriorly seen infiltrating the retromolar trigone and extending to involve infra-auricular region.

Superiorly reaching upto superior border of right zygomatic arch and involves infratemporal fossa.

Inferiorly extending upto right submandibular gland with suspicious loss of fat planes.

The lesion shows lost fat planes with parotid gland laterally.

Bony resorption of superior alveolar process of maxilla noted on right side

Right retro maxillary fat plane is maintained.

Right maxillary sinus is obliterated with mucosal thickening with breech in the anterolateral wall.

IMPRESSION:

Large ill defined soft tissue density lesion involving posterior body, ramus of mandible on right side causing its destruction with few cystic areas and calcifications within
