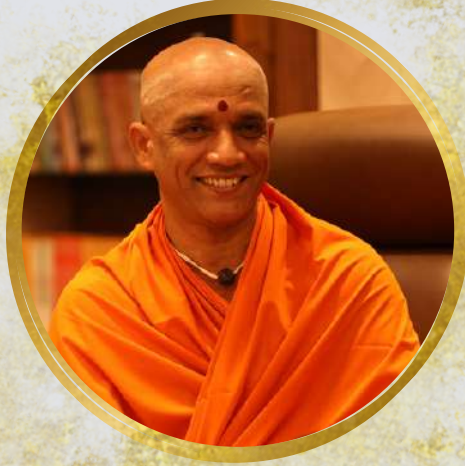

NATIONAL DEWORMING DAY - 2026

Community Outreach Program: The Department of Community Medicine and NSS Units I & II of Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, under Adichunchanagiri University, conducted a National Deworming Day Awareness Program on 10th February 2026 at the Primary and High School in Kuchahalli in collaboration with PHC Gondenahalli. The program educated students on prevention of worm infestation through regular deworming, balanced nutrition, and proper hand hygiene. Interns led interactive sessions with live handwashing demonstrations, while Phase-I MBBS students displayed charts on the worm life cycle, diet, and hygiene. Around 150 students benefited, gaining awareness of preventive health, and the activity provided valuable community-based learning experience for the students.



SAY NO TO TOBACCO: SCHOOL AWARENESS PROGRAM 2026

Community Outreach Program: The Department of Community Medicine, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, under Adichunchanagiri University, conducted a Tobacco Awareness Program on 12th February 2026 at Kembare High School in collaboration with CHC Bellur. The program educated students on the harmful effects of smoking and smokeless tobacco, risks of addiction, and serious health consequences such as cancer, respiratory, and heart diseases, while also highlighting key provisions of the COTPA Act.



Health education was delivered by Dr. Sujean and Mr. Nagaraja, supported by interns and the Health Inspector. Students actively participated in discussions and a painting activity promoting anti-tobacco messages.

CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS AND FREE HPV SCREENING PROGRAM 2026

The Department of Pathology and the Department of Obstetrics & Gynaecology (OBG), AIMS, ACU, in association with the Indian Academy of Cytologists – Karnataka Chapter (IAC–KC) and IAC–KCIAPM, organized a Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Program on 24th February 2026 at the BGS Global Broadcasting Centre, AIMS, to promote cervical cancer prevention and early detection.

Dr. Amita K, Professor and Head, Department of Pathology, highlighted the importance of regular screening and preventive oncology, followed by an awareness talk by Dr. Rakshita H.B. on HPV and its role in cervical cancer.

Faculty and postgraduate students of the Department of Pathology successfully conducted free HPV DNA testing for 110 women using self-collected kits. The program strengthened community outreach, enhanced awareness on HPV and cervical cancer prevention, and reaffirmed the institution's commitment to women's health and early detection initiatives.



CERVICAL CANCER AWARENESS AND SCREENING PROGRAM - SAFE CERVIX: SCREENING IN ACTION FOR EARLY DETECTION OF CERVICAL CANCER

The Department of Pathology, AIMS, conducted a one-day Cervical Cancer Awareness and Screening Program on 4th February 2026 at Mandya in association with Akhil Bharatiya Terapanth Mahila Mandal. The program aimed to create awareness about cervical cancer, promote early detection, encourage women's participation in preventive health programs, and conduct HPV DNA testing.

Dr. Amita K, Professor & HOD, delivered an awareness talk highlighting risk factors, prevention, and the importance of regular screening. HPV DNA testing was carried out by Dr. Rakshitha H.B., Dr. Rajini T, Dr. Bhairavi, and Dr. Tejashwini. A total of 75 women from the local community were screened.



Participants appreciated the session and screening facility, expressing improved understanding of cervical cancer prevention. The program successfully enhanced awareness, strengthened community outreach, and reinforced the institution's commitment to women's health and preventive healthcare. The initiative also emphasized the importance of regular follow-up and timely medical consultation. It created a supportive platform for women to discuss health concerns openly. The camp marked a meaningful step toward reducing the burden of cervical cancer through early diagnosis and prevention.

WORLD CANCER DAY – CANCER AWARENESS AND SCREENING CAMP 2026

On the occasion of World Cancer Day, the Departments of Surgery, OBG, ENT, Oncology, Community Medicine, Radiology, and Dental Sciences, in association with AIMS Youth Red Cross and NSS, organized a Cancer Awareness and Screening Camp on 4th February 2026 at the New Pharmacy Hall, AHRC New Building, B.G. Nagara. The program was attended by 50 members of the public and 30 YRC and NSS volunteers. It was inaugurated by Sri Sri Sathkeerthinatha Swamiji along with Dr. K. M. Shivakumar (Chief of Hospital), Dr. K. S. Ravi (Vice Principal), Dr. Aliya Nusrath (Vice Principal), and other dignitaries.



The session began with a welcome address by Mr. Nithyananda K, MBBS Phase III student. Dr. K. M.
