National Youth Day 2026 was observed on 12 January 2026 by the Department of Community Medicine, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS) in collaboration with AIMS NSS Unit 1 & 2, the Student Support Cell, and the Student Council at LH-1. “Promoting Responsible Road Use: Road Safety Awareness Program 2026”

Department of Community Medicine, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS), Faculty of Medical and Allied Health Sciences, Adichunchanagiri University, organized a Road Safety Awareness Program on 22 January 2026 at Lecture Hall-1, AIMS, as part of Road Safety Awareness Month 2026. The program was conducted by AIMS NSS Units 1 and 2 in collaboration with the Assistant Regional Transport Office (ARTO), Nagamangala Taluk, and was attended by university bus and ambulance drivers along with MBBS Phase I students. The event was inaugurated in the presence of dignitaries including Mr. Honnegowda, ARTO, Senior Inspector Mr. Satheesh CS, Sub Inspector Ms. Shabaz Banu, Mr. Ravikumar, Police Sub Inspector, Bellur, and administrative officials of AIMS—Dr. M G Shivaramu, Principal and Dean, Dr. Aliya Nusrath, Vice Principal, Mr. B K Umesh, Finance Officer and Registrar, Dr. Somshekar, RMO, and Dr. Varsha G, NSS Unit 2 Officer. AIMS Faculty Contribution at Medical Yatra at Indore, MP

The Medical Yatra Medical Camp (Healing with Purpose) and Conference was held from 17th–27th January 2026 at Robert Nursing Home, Indore, Madhya Pradesh, organized by AIPNO, Medical Yatra, Mangala Prem Trust, and the Rotary Club of Indore. **Representing Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS), Dr. Mahendra G, Professor & HOD of Obstetrics and Gynecology, and Dr. Bhoomika N Raj, Junior Resident, participated alongside 23 doctors from the Cleveland Clinic to provide free multispecialty healthcare services.**

A major focus was cervical cancer screening using dry swab collection and HPV DNA RT-PCR with on-site processing. During 18th–19th January, 60 women were screened, with 8 testing positive for high-risk HPV; six returned for follow-up and four underwent free thermal ablation with counseling for annual HPV testing. By the fifth day, 450–500 women had been screened, significantly improving early detection and awareness.

Under the guidance of Dr. Stacie Jhaveri, the AIMS team received hands-on training in HPV DNA RT-PCR processing. The AIMS team's active involvement significantly strengthened community outreach, preventive women's health, and international academic collaboration.

Additionally, Dr. Amita K, Professor, and Dr. Rajini T, Associate Professor, Department of Pathology, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS), participated in the Medical Yatra Medical Camp (Healing with Purpose) and Conference held from 17th–27th January 2026 at Robert Nursing Home, Indore, Madhya Pradesh, organized by AIPNO, Medical Yatra, Mangala Prem Trust, and the Rotary Club of Indore.

The program had a major focus on cervical cancer awareness and screening, aimed at promoting early detection and strengthening preventive healthcare services for women. During the camp, the faculty actively contributed to laboratory and screening support activities and presented their research, adding significant academic value to the initiative. Their participation reinforced the institute's commitment to community outreach, preventive women's health, and research-driven healthcare services, further strengthening the integration of academic excellence with meaningful community engagement and preventive healthcare.



National Anti-Leprosy Day and Martyrs' Day – 2026

The Department of Dermatology, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences, in collaboration with the Community Health Centre, Hirisave, organized a free leprosy screening and skin health camp on 30 January 2026 at CHC Hirisave, Channarayapatna, in observance of National Anti-Leprosy Day and Martyrs' Day. The programme aimed to raise awareness about leprosy, promote early detection, address stigma, and provide free medical consultation. The inaugural session commenced at 10:30 AM with an invocation by Ms. Anvitha (Intern, AIMS) and a welcome address by Mr. Umesh B.K., Registrar, AIMS, followed by a two-minute silence in tribute to Mahatma Gandhi. Dr. Rakshith D (PG, Dermatology) spoke on leprosy symptoms and treatment, while Dr. Ravi K.S (Vice Principal & HOD, ENT) highlighted Gandhiji's role in leprosy care, and Dr. Shivaswami (AMO, CHC Hirisave) emphasized preventive measures. The event was attended by Dr. Yogesh D (HOD, Dermatology) and Mr. Dharmendra Y.P. (PRO, AIMS), with Dr. Rakshith D also anchoring the programme.

A public awareness rally with pamphlet distribution was conducted. The camp benefited approximately 50 patients, who were screened for leprosy and other skin conditions, reinforcing the message that leprosy is curable with early diagnosis.



“Guest Lecture on Clinical Anatomy of the Lower Limb: Bridging Anatomy with Clinical Practice”

The Department of Anatomy, Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS), organized an institutional-level Guest Lecture titled “Clinical Anatomy of Lower Limb” on 29th January 2026 at Lecture Hall I, AIMS, commencing at 11:00 a.m. The programme was attended by approximately 250 Phase I MBBS students and over 15 teaching faculty members.

The event began with an invitational song, followed by the formal inauguration through the lighting of the lamp by the Hon’ble Principal Dr. M. G. Shivaramu and Vice-Principal Dr. Aliya Nusrath, in the presence of senior faculty members. The Chief Guest, Dr. Seema Deepak, Professor of Anatomy, MMC&RI, Mysuru, was felicitated by the Principal in recognition of her academic contributions.

Dr. Seema Deepak delivered an informative lecture focusing on the clinical and applied aspects of lower limb anatomy, emphasizing nerve lesions, vascular importance, common injuries, and examination-oriented concepts. The programme concluded with a valedictory address by Dr. Tejaswi H. L., Professor and Head, Department of Anatomy, followed by the presentation of a certificate of appreciation to the Chief Guest. Feedback from participants highlighted the lecture as highly informative, clinically relevant, and well organized.

Overall, the guest lecture successfully achieved its objectives by strengthening students’ understanding of applied anatomy and promoting clinically oriented learning. Similar academic sessions are recommended to further enrich medical education.

Training Programme on Safe Blood Transfusion Essentials

The AH RC Blood Centre and Blood Transfusion Committee, AHRC, organized a Training Programme on Safe Blood Transfusion Essentials for nursing staff on 28th and 29th January 2026 at the BGS Global Broadcasting Centre, AIMS. The institutional program saw the participation of approximately 140 nursing staff and aimed to enhance knowledge and skills in safe blood transfusion practices, in line with standard blood centre and hospital protocols, with a strong emphasis on patient safety.

The program commenced with a session by Dr. Nandini S. Raj, Blood Centre Officer, AH RC, who highlighted the importance of pre-transfusion work-up, including accurate patient identification, proper blood sample collection and labeling, mandatory documentation, and an understanding of blood grouping, cross-matching, and appropriate component selection. Key aspects of the safe issue, transportation, storage, and temperature maintenance of blood and blood components were also discussed.



The training further emphasized safe transfusion practices, covering pre-administration checks, bedside verification, correct administration techniques, appropriate infusion rates, and strict adherence to standard operating procedures. Nurses were trained in patient monitoring, early recognition of transfusion reactions, accurate documentation, and prompt reporting and coordination with the blood centre and treating physicians, reinforcing the delivery of safe and quality transfusion services.

National Voter's Day – 2026

The Department of Community Medicine, along with NSS Units I & II of Adichunchanagiri Institute of Medical Sciences (AIMS), in association with the Electoral Literacy Club (ELC), AIMS, organized the 16th National Voter's Day – 2026 at the Lecture Hall, AIMS, under the theme "My India, My Vote." Day one focused on AI applications in research and academic writing, covering literature search, writing tools, data analysis, plagiarism detection, and ethical considerations through hands-on training. Day two emphasized AI in medical education, highlighting AI-based teaching aids, assessment tools, and student engagement strategies such as quizzes and gamification. Faculty members, postgraduate students, and Scientific Committee members actively participated in interactive discussions, practical demonstrations, and collaborative activities. Overall, the workshop effectively blended theoretical concepts with real-world applications, significantly enhancing participants' analytical skills, understanding of ethical AI practices, and awareness of clinical research initiatives promoted by ISCR.

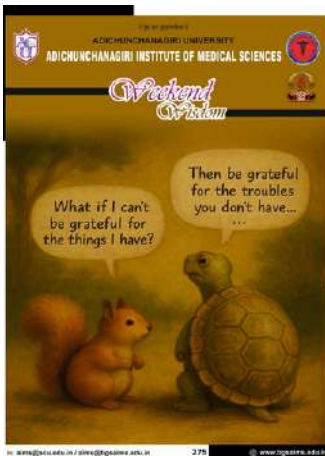


"AIMS Students Achieve Championship at Inter-College Cricket Competition"

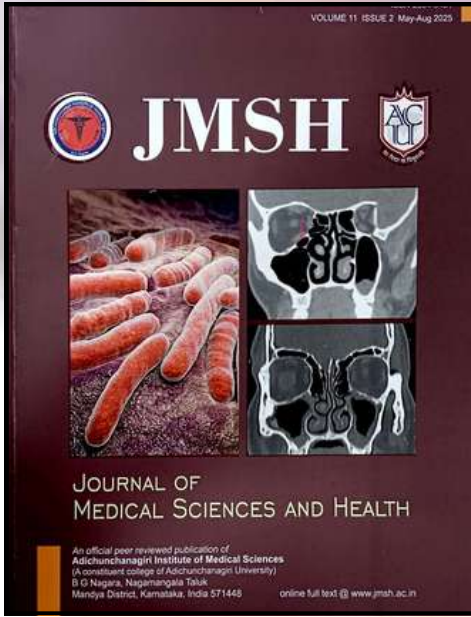


AIMS Marks a Milestone with the 275th Issue of "Weekend Wisdom"

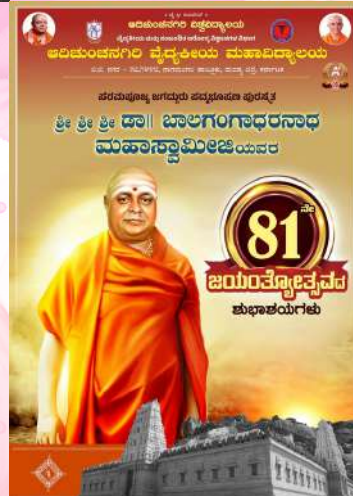
